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# Zarina's Story

In many parts of the world, girls face barriers to education and opportunities to earn a living.

In Afghanistan, Zarmina felt frustrated by her community's belief that a girl's place is in the home and not in the classroom. Wanting to improve her daughters' lives, Zarmina participated in gender equality training with PWS&D's local partner in Afghanistan.

After the workshop, Zarmina shared what she had learned about a child's right to an education with village leaders and other mothers and fathers. As a result of her advocacy, the community now enthusiastically supports girl's education.

"We hope that one day there will be no child out of school, not only in our community but in the entire country," Zarmina shares.
