# PWS&D Response to COVID-10

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has many of us feeling uncertain about the future. What began as a global health crisis has only worsened the inequalities that exist for so many around the world.

What is PWS&D doing about it?

PWS&D is responding through the ACT Alliance where rapid response projects have started in 14 countries. Adjustments have been made to programs in every country where PWS&D works, repurposing funds for planned activities which are not currently possible. Projects are helping affected people access food, sanitation and hygiene,

protective equipment and psycho-social support. PWS&D will also provide support to longer-term ACT Alliance COVID-19 projects.

# Afghanistan

In Afghanistan, PWS&D's partner, Community World Service Asia, is hosting awareness sessions where community members learn preventive measures to keep their families safe from COVID-19. Schools in Afghanistan are also closed. While some students are being educated via online classes, TV and radio, many students in rural areas lack access to these resources. Through our girls' education project, CWSA is hoping to introduce self-help study packages for students, as well as connecting teachers with students through phones or safe visits for assistance.

# Ghana

In Ghana, which has some of the highest COVID-19 numbers in west Africa, PWS&D's partner is encouraging preventative actions, including social distancing wherever possible and good sanitation and hygiene practices, especially handwashing.

Please remember this essential work of PWS&D and its partners in your prayers and with your donations. A gift of \$20 or \$50 can provide personal protective equipment (PPE) for health workers or help families put food on their tables when livelihoods are threatened.
