Rohingya Family Carries on Despite Challenges

Fleeing at a moment's notice wasn't an option for Nosomakatun and her two children who are dependent on wheelchairs for mobility.

But facing the increasing violence against Rohingya people in Myanmar, Nosomakatun's family were eventually forced to leave their homes. Since 2017, almost 750,000 Rohingya refugees have been forced to leave their homes in Myanmar.

The journey to safety brought about new challenges for the family, most crucially a lack of nutritious food.

Thankfully Nosomakatun and her family were able to receive food vouchers from a PWS&D-supported Canadian Foodgrains Bank project. With the vouchers, families can purchase a variety of nutritious foods to complement the rice, oil and lentils they are receiving from the World Food Programme.

These days, Nosomakatun is grateful to see her family safe, better nourished and more resilient to illness. "We are so thankful for the food," she shares.

This Advent season help those displaced by conflict find strength and nourishment for their bodies as they journey to find peace.

We will ensure that all gifts are tallied and ornaments placed on our Advent tree. For those sharing gifts of cleaning, or phoning, please email, or otherwise contact one of the committee members and we will ensure that your gift is recognized. This week we will be waiting at the back door of the church on Saturday from noon until 3 for those who would like to drop off a physical gift. Next week, there will be someone there at noon on Wednesday and again on Saturday. We look forward to seeing you.

Not much has changed in the list from last week. Please take a look at what is there. As we have already mentioned, if you are providing a monetary donation, and you can't find an item for the agency within your price range, simply donate an amount that you feel comfortable with. There will always be someone else in the same position, and between the two/three/four of you the cost of the item will be covered.

As mentioned last week, there are three ways to participate in this year's Advent Appeal.

You can purchase the items and bring them to the church on Wednesdays and Saturdays (noon to 3) starting in Advent. We will start receiving the gifts on Saturday, November 28th (the day before the start of Advent) and will continue until December 16th. If you can't wait to get rid of your gifts, please give Al a call at 306-244-7386 and arrange a drop off time. You can also drop them off directly to the agency, but if you do this please let one of the Outreach Committee know so that they can credit you with the gift and add your ornament to the Advent Tree.

If you plan on shopping off of the provided list and then donating an amount equivalent to the cost of the gift, there are a couple ways of doing this. One way is to simply go to the St. Andrew's website and click on our DONATE button. Where it asks where you would like your donation allocated select 'other', enter the amount you wish to spend, and then down at the bottom of the window you can add a note to say that it is for the Advent appeal **AND** please add the name of the agency you would like to support. By doing this we can add an ornament to the tree, and direct your donation to your preferred agency. E-Transfer can also be used if you are more comfortable with it. Make sure that you include the same information; that it is for the Advent Appeal, and the agency that you wish to receive the donation.

The last way of donating is through our FundScrip program. Not only do you support the agencies, you support St. Andrew's as well. Contact Arline Sanderson if you wish to contribute in this way.

With the upsurge in infections recently, it is more important than ever to find ways of reaching beyond our wall to touch the lives and show the love of God to others within our community. Thank you for all of your help!
