As the Year ends, the Thermometer is on the Rise---

The thermometer in the entranceway has been updated to reflect the state of finances to the end of November. The General Fund sits at 94% of the proposed budget and funds raised to meet the ambitious Presbyterians Sharing goal are at 80%. Thank you for all offerings, as you contemplate the remainder of the year and your financial contributions for next year.

In order to redress the legacy of residential schools and advance the process of Canadian reconciliation, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission made 94 Calls to Action; this week we are reminded of Call to Action #10.

10. We call on the federal government to draft new Aboriginal education legislation with the full participation and informed consent of Aboriginal peoples. The new legislation would include a commitment to sufficient funding and would incorporate the following principles: i. Providing sufficient funding to close identified educational achievement gaps within one generation. ii. Improving education attainment levels and success rates. iii. Developing culturally appropriate curricula. iv. Protecting the right to Aboriginal languages, including the teaching of Aboriginal languages as credit courses. v. Enabling parental and community responsibility, control, and accountability, similar to what parents enjoy in public school systems. vi. Enabling parents to fully participate in the education of their children. vii. Respecting and honouring Treaty relationships.

CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE


Christmas Eve Worship will begin at 7pm. Come in person, or watch from home. Live streamed, and available later on YouTube.

Improving Health Across Generations in Guatemala

For eight years, Blanca Juárez Tomas has participated in Flor de Tuichmad'il—a women's collective dedicated to promoting health and nutrition among her community in Guatemala. Blanca shares how being involved in this group has allowed her to support her own well-being and that of the next two generations in her family.

"Before I became part of the women's group Flor de Tuichmad'il...my life was very different. I didn't give as much importance to nutrition for both me and my family. The foods we consumed did not have sources of protein, and we did not take into account the importance of properly washing the food that we ate, which often led to illness.


When I became part of the AMMID association, I learned which foods contain protein and the importance of hygiene at home.

Now, my family is healthier, and I am teaching my children to put these things into practice with my grandchildren so that they can enjoy good health."

Through gifts to Presbyterians Sharing, Cyclical PCC supports many important outreach ministries in Canada. One such ministry is the Presbytery of Montreal's Communauté Rivière des Prairies, a new worshipping community in the city's east end. Rivière des Prairies embraces multilingualism in their church services and children's programming, providing an open and welcoming space for newcomers to Canada. Over five different languages and dialects are used by the ministry to connect with newcomers, both in the church family and in the wider community.
