

For several years, St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church has been blessed to be in relationship with our friend-in-mission Ty McKenzie, first in his role as Chaplain at the Lighthouse, and now in his new role at Salvation Army Bethany Home. This morning, we are grateful to be able to give thanks to Ty and Bethany Home for all of their wonderful work in being a place of stability and support for so many. As we give a token of support from our church's Memorial Fund, we also pray that we may remain partners for years to come.

The Advent Walk to Bethlehem, undertaken by some members of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church-Saskatoon, was successfully completed. In Biblical times, the journey was about 145 km and we can only imagine the conditions that Mary and Joseph endured. We may have Ice, snow, sleet and detours at times to slow us down in Saskatoon. Mary was in her third trimester and no one knows positively that she rode a donkey the whole way. We know that they travelled upward, due to Bethlehem being located in the Judean Mountains, and in some places the paths were inaccessible. Weather conditions, minimum food, thieves and dangerous animals would have jeopardized their travels. We, at St. Andrew's, have collectively travelled 226.35 km as of Wednesday December 20, still leaving a few more days for members walking, swimming. bike-riding and jogging as we anticipate the birth of Our Saviour, Jesus Christ, Our Lord." #### **Restorative Justice Event**

On Sunday, January 15<sup>th</sup> St Andrew's will be part of a leadership team that is hosting an "Interfaith-Ecumenical - Everyone is Welcome" - Youth Night at Zion Lutheran. Our guest will be Dave Feick from The Micah Mission. Our theme is Restorative Justice which also- the theme of the 2023 Week of Christian Unity

Two key activities happening at this event.

- 1."You Got Booked" is played as a life-sized board game, facilitated by MCC staff. The activity highlights the racial disparities within the criminal justice system and outlines how people find themselves in a criminal or poverty cycle. STR8 UP is a gang exit strategy that uses story sharing as a model for accountability, capacity building and healing for its members. STR8 UP members tell their personal stories of crime, violence and gang affiliation which offers a first-person perspective to a lived experience that is explored through You Got Booked.
- **2.**" **Hat, scarf & glove**" toss- we will be tossing these items along the river into trees and bushes with the words "this item is for you- you are loved". These items are for the unhoused citizens of Saskatoon. RSVP: Sunday, January 15, 2022,

#### Even in the face of poverty, injustice and disaster, hope finds a way.


