Pastoral Care Nurse asks, "Have you noticed?"

I wonder whether you have noticed that medical staff who are seen on television giving vaccinations in care homes, as one example, have on Personal Protective Equipment but are not often seen wearing gloves during the actual administration of the vaccine.

This is because the covid-19 virus does not transmit skin-to-skin UNLESS the administrator has an open area on their hands or there is possibility of contacting body fluids. Then you will see that person who is giving the vaccine wearing gloves, which are disposed of immediately after the vaccination is given.

Protection from Covid-19 and Variants

Please continue your 20 second hand-washing frequently, social distancing and wearing your mask. With one of the Covid variants present in Saskatchewan this week, you may want to invest in wearing two masks when you are out and about doing essential chores or upgrading and investing in N95 masks. Once paper masks become wet, the safest thing is to dispose of them in a lined garbage can and replace them.

Cloth masks should be cleaned by:

- Washing in a washing machine with soap and hot water
- Steaming for 10 to 15 minutes.
- Heating at 70 C for one hour.
- Immersing in boiling water for 30 seconds
- Dry thoroughly. Damp cloth does not provide the best barrier.
