As June concludes as a month we have reflected on indigenous history. Here are more resources gathered by our Synod Youth Coordinator. We are called to reflect upon the damage that the residential school system has done - to survivors, to families, and to entire communities - and to take time to remember the children who never came home. Recognizing that this is a system that the Presbyterian Church

in Canada actively participated in, we call to mind the 1994 Confession and remind ourselves that we need to live out that confession and continue our work toward learning the truth, healing and reconciliation.

Rev. Devon shares (attached list) some great resources from the PCC; children's audio books, possible activities, prayers, information on the PCC's participation in the residential School system, links to National Film Board videos, You-Tube videos, some music, and a list of books by Indigenous authors. These are excellent for all ages. Parents, it is always good to watch or read items once before sharing with your younger children.

Our librarian, Pat Barber, displayed our collection of Indigenous authors in the narthex for signing out. They are always available.

I hope the summer provides opportunity to visit local Indigenous history and culture centres like Wanuskewain or Batoche. As people of all ages listen, learn and develop relationships.

Welcome Summer Family worship!

Children of all ages are welcome in the worship service. Midway through the service, the Minister will share Children's Time with them. There is a cart in the entranceway with the current week's children's bulletin and supplies for colouring with a bight coloured clipboard. We ask the clipboard, crayons, pencils etc. be returned at the end of each service to the cart- as our Ghanaian Church meets each Sunday afternoon. If you have questions about any children-related topics, each Sunday there's a CE Ambassador to help you - they will be sitting in one of the last rows of the sanctuary.



MISSION MOMENT

In Malawi, Winson is the sole guardian of his 11-year-old grandson, Emmanuel. Emmanuel, who is HIV positive, was often sick in the first nine years of his life despite being on antiretroviral drugs to treat his HIV status. One day, Winson attended a workshop on making backyard gardens, where he learned how these gardens can improve nutrition. Inspired, Winson planted his own backyard garden with various vegetables. **The garden has not only improved his family's diet but has also become a source of income.**



Now, Emmanuel is not getting sick as often as he used to. This project, providing assistance to vulnerable children and their caregivers, is supported through the church by Presbyterian World Service & Development.
