OUTREACH OPPORTUNITIES

Has anyone else noticed just how quickly the weeks seem to be disappearing recently? It must be the increased length of the days and the warmth of the sun that is causing it.

This week we heard from the YWCA Women's Shelter.

Items that they are especially in need of are full-sized (unscented if possible) bottles of shampoo, conditioner and lotions for the women staying with them. They are also looking for razors, deodorant, toothpaste/brushes and sun screen. One thing that they are doing that is different from the other agencies is that they are willing to accept gently used (or new!) towels and facecloths, but they do launder them before providing them to the residents. As always, monetary donations are more than welcome. This can be done directly, or through the church. Please specify the YWCA Crisis Shelter for these donations. For direct donations, you will receive a tax receipt for amounts over \$20.

Their main doors are open every day and you can drop items off in the lobby if you wish. Another way to drop off items is to leave the items outside the door and then phone the desk at 306-244-2844 and they will come out and pick them up.

Below is a summary of items requested by the other agencies that we have highlighted in the past few weeks.

Crisis Nursery

- Paper goods (toilet paper, Kleenex, paper towels etc.)
- Grocery items (fruit, cheese, yoghurt, veggies and unsweetened snacks that children will eat)
- Monetary or gift card donations

Friendship Inn

- Grocery items (canned goods, rice, carrots, onions, juice boxes, soup stocks, granola bars, flour etc.)
- Toothbrushes/paste, shampoo/conditioner and deodorant
- Formula and diapers

Interval House

• Gift cards or monetary donations for the moment

Egadz

- Hotel sized bottles of shampoo, condition and lotion.
- Toothbrushes/paste
- Fresh fruit and vegetables to help provide a supper meal for the youth during the week.
- Formula
- New socks or underwear.

As always, we are looking for new ways that we can reach out and share God's love with those in our community. The **St. ANDREW'S PRESBYTERIAN WALKING GROUP** Meewasin Valley Trail concluded their journey with host, Jeff O'Brien who is the Chief Archivist for the City of Saskatoon.

Prayer Walking We are most fortunate to have had his professional expertise for this month of May 2020 as he researched, prepared, and presented the virtual journey

that we completed – or are about to complete. His daily text, audio and pictures of the 30 stops in 30 days along the East and West sides of the South Saskatchewan River made the package available to all of us in a most friendly way. When I approached Jeff about such a pilot project, I really was impressed and overwhelmed with what he proposed to do. On behalf of our Walking Group, I want to thank Jeff for an outstanding journey. Some of the evaluations have indicated that people who grew up in Saskatoon "learned some interesting and fascinating details about the city's development and history. The pictures that Jeff included brought the past to life in many cases. My husband and I walked every day and sometimes more." Another comment from a walker: "A friend and myself have walked the Meewasin Trail from Avenue M to the Chemical Plant to the CN Bridge and it meant a great deal to have his pertinent commentaries." Others rode their bikes in their homes, others walked in the hallways or in a circle around their home. A few were joined by spouses, and some were out of province, out of the country.
