PWS&D Lenten Appeal

for increased Food Security needs during COVID In Afghanistan, Razia and her four children were displaced from

their home in the Waras district of the Bamyan province. Living conditions had worsened as COVID-19 caused many livelihood opportunities to disappear.

With no place to call home and abandoned by her husband, the thirty-five-year-old mother, along with her three young daughters and son, sought refuge in a nearby village. The family found shelter—making a home for themselves in a spare room of a mosque that was traditionally used to host meetings and gatherings. The conditions of the space were challenging to live in, with no electricity, gas or water supply. In the winter, the concrete room became very cold.

Still, Razia and her children tried to make the best of the situation, seeking limited employment opportunities to help sustain themselves. Najib, Razia's eldest son, runs an ice cream cart in the summer and works in a recycling shop during the winter months, earning about \$3.25 (CAD) a day. Razia and her three daughters knit and embroider handicrafts to sell. However, with COVID-19 impacting people's purchasing ability, Razia has not received many orders, making the situation extremely challenging for the family to make ends meet.

In response to the overwhelming impact of COVID-19, PWS&D's local partner in Afghanistan is distributing monthly cash transfers to 1,100 vulnerable households. The funds allow families to purchase much-needed food and essential items. The five-month project is made possible with support from partners at Canadian Foodgrains Bank and the Government of Canada.

With this support, Razia and many other families are better prepared to combat food insecurity. Razia is now less stressed about where her family's next meal will come from or how she will manage her household expenses in the harsh winter months. "We were blessed this season as the cash helped us to purchase essential groceries including flour, rice, oil, vegetables, wood and gas. I have also bought warm clothing for my children so the winters will be warm and comfortable," she shares.



Do you have a difficult question for God? February 2 at 4:00pm we began a Zoom bible study titled Hard Questions. Through the bible study, a cross section of Christians from various locations will embark on a journey of exploration. The study uses videos, song, and devotions to encourage group interaction.

Each week, participants will be asked to provide bible verses that speak to them about the topic.

This will be a bible study that may be a bit out of the ordinary for us. First it is led by a lay person, namely Orlanda Drebit. Secondly, there will be no book. Third, the bible study is sponsored by St. Andrews, but will include participants from outside of the church, and in fact from outside of Saskatoon. (If you are wondering why the time, it has been established to accommodate multiple time zones.)




Fourth Sunday in Lent

A Home Away from Home

Accused of bewitching her niece after she fell ill, Zenabu Sugri began to fear for her safety in her own home.

In Ghana, where belief in witchcraft is widespread, it is often used to explain unusual and unfortunate events. Unfortunately, older women like Zenabu, are blamed and subjected to cruel treatment and discrimination when accused.

After suffering from relentless taunting, Zenabu found sanctuary at the PWS&D-supported Gambaga Camp—a refuge for women accused of witchcraft.

Zenabu has now found a sense of belonging with the community of women. At the camp, she's learnt how to make soap and sells it to earn an income. "It is peaceful. I am in good health and getting enough to eat," Zenabu shared.

This Lenten season faithfully respond to Christ's call to serve the marginalized. Through support for PWS&D, we can combat stigma and discrimination while supporting the vulnerable to lead peaceful and secure lives.
