PWS&D Lenten Appeal
for increased Food Security
needs during COVID
In Afghanistan, Razia and her
four children were displaced from

their home in the Waras district of the Bamyan province. Living conditions had worsened as COVID-19 caused many livelihood opportunities to disappear.

With no place to call home and abandoned by her husband, the thirty-five-year-old mother, along with her three young daughters and son, sought refuge in a nearby village. The family found shelter—making a home for themselves in a spare room of a mosque that was traditionally used to host meetings and gatherings. The conditions of the space were challenging to live in, with no electricity, gas or water supply. In the winter, the concrete room became very cold.

Still, Razia and her children tried to make the best of the situation, seeking limited employment opportunities to help sustain themselves. Najib, Razia's eldest son, runs an ice cream cart in the summer and works in a recycling shop during the winter months, earning about \$3.25 (CAD) a day. Razia and her three daughters knit and embroider handicrafts to sell. However, with COVID-19 impacting people's purchasing ability, Razia has not received many orders, making the situation extremely challenging for the family to make ends meet.

In response to the overwhelming impact of COVID-19, PWS&D's local partner in Afghanistan is distributing monthly cash transfers to 1,100 vulnerable households. The funds allow families to purchase much-needed food and essential items. The five-month project is made possible with support from partners at Canadian Foodgrains Bank and the Government of Canada.

With this support, Razia and many other families are better prepared to combat food insecurity. Razia is now less stressed about where her family's next meal will come from or how she will manage her household expenses in the harsh winter months. "We were blessed this season as the cash helped us to purchase essential groceries including flour, rice, oil, vegetables, wood and gas. I have also bought warm clothing for my children so the winters will be warm and comfortable," she shares.

COVID-19: How to know your calls are from the SHA – Pastoral Care Committee

The Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) has some tips for helping the public know when a phone call is from the SHA for individuals receiving calls about test results and contact tracing:

□ Partial information exchange to confirm identity: At the beginning of the call, the SHA will provide the recipient with the first three digits of their Saskatchewan Health Card number. The recipient will then be asked to provide the last three digits of their health card. The SHA may also ask individuals to confirm their first and last name, and date of birth. This will ensure that both the caller and recipient are legitimate.

o NOTE: This partial information exchange may not be possible in all situations; for example, when an individual is initially contacted by the SHA to inform them they are a close contact of a positive case. In these instances, the SHA may only have the individual's first name and phone number.

□ Call-back option: If you are unsure of the legitimacy of the caller or you prefer not to answer your phone when an unknown number appears, please take note of the number and call back to verify that it is an SHA number. When calling back, you will either be connected with an SHA representative or receive a recording indicating you have reached the Saskatchewan Health Authority and that a representative of the SHA will try to reach you again from the same number.

When the SHA calls, it is possible that the number displayed on your phone may be from out of country. This is because the SHA is using a Hosted Call Centre. If you prefer not to answer an unknown call, please take note of the number and call back to verify. This is especially important during the pandemic in order to protect yourself and your loved ones from potentially fraudulent calls.

Remember to also take protective measures against COVID-19, including: wearing a mask, physical distancing, washing your hands, staying home when sick and getting tested.

Women Farmers Ensure Food Security

In the village of Mwenitanga in Malawi, Twambilire inspected the soil that lay beneath the layers of flimsy husks on her plot of land.

Twambilire had witnessed the effects of climate change on her farm in the frequency and severity of both droughts and rain—events that make it difficult for her to grow enough food to eat and sell at the market.

One day, Twambilire decided to sign up for a PWS&D-supported program teaching conservation agriculture. At the workshop, she learned to farm in a way that encourages crop rotation, organic fertilizers and minimal soil disturbance.

Twambilire proudly shares that since mulching her plot and implementing what she had learned, her once-degraded soil is now fertile and healthy. She has also become a lead farmer with the PWS&D project, teaching other farmers in her community about conservation agriculture.

This Lenten season faithfully respond with PWS&D as we help farmers adapt to climate change so that they can increase their yields and improve nutrition for their families.
