PRESBYTERIANS IN EARLY SASKATOON

The year 1926 was a major milestone for St. Andrew's. The first annual congregational meeting was held on January 19, 1926. Active membership stood at 340,299 by Certificate and 41 by Confession of Faith.

After a year of meeting in rented space, the top priority was having their own sanctuary. On March 9, 1926, David Webster and Angus McMillan were appointed to find a suitable site.

The Building Committee was formed to raise funds, plan and supervise the erection of the Church.

A Sibbald was the Chairman. The sod was turned at the site on 4th Avenue and 20th Street. On May 26, 1926, by Mrs. McCarrell, head of the National W.M.S., every group was active in raising money for the cost. Because the congregation was anxious to move in before winter, the decision was made to put a roof over the basement section and build the main floor later. (Due to the Great Depression, that never happened,) The dimensions were 55 feet wide, 64 feet long, with seating for 550. The inside was plaster and lath. The exterior was stucco. In addition to usual sanctuary and choir space, there was a kitchen and small pantry, two separate rooms, furnace room and coal-cellar, two toilets, a large entrance vestibule with storage room underneath. It was steam heated and had a fire-proof roof.

Every group raised money for furnishings. The pulpit was given by the Boys' Club. The Communion table was provided by the Girls' Club. The organ and other gifts were from the Women's Club. The pulpit Bible was from the J.H. Anderson Family. The pulpit Hymn Book was from the Young People's Society. The piano was given by the Choir. Communion linens were given by the John H. Anderson Family while the John A. Anderson Family provided the Chalice for Communion. The L. Roblin Family gave the offering plates. Twenty-four kindergarten chairs came from T.A.S. Campbell. Other items presented were wall racks for hymn books, picture rails for the vestry, linoleum for the aisles, kitchen glassware, mirrors, flower stands and bulletin boards. The Boys' Club (with help from Dads) built all the tables used for banquets.

The Dedication of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church took place on October 3, 1926. The Order of Service showed that: first, the Congregation will rise and join in the Lord's Prayer (using Debts and Debtors). Next was the reading of Psalm 80, followed by the Scripture Lesson and a Hymn. A male quartet sang, followed by announcements and offering. The Anthem, "Ye Shall Dwell in the Land" was sung by the Choir. Another hymn, followed by the Sermon and Prayer, was by guest Minister, Rev. McQueen of Edmonton. The morning service was closed by the singing of "Glorious Things of Thee are Spoken" and the Benediction.

But, wait, there was more! At 2:30 p.m., the Rally Day Service was held, followed by a Baptismal Service.

At 4:00 p.m., they squeezed in a Public Worship in the Gaelic Language!

At 7:00 p.m., the service started by the singing of "Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow" and Invocation: Scriptures and Psalms followed. Then, came the announcements and Offering (the Board of Management just couldn't help themselves! They asked for a generous offering.)

More hymns, anthems, a sermon by Rev. Dr. McQueen brought the service near the end to sing, "O God Our Help In Ages Past". It closed with the Benediction.

For more than 75 years, the church and PWS&D have been dedicated to serving those in need across the globe. In collaboration with our partners, we are creating meaningful change in our shared world. Working together, we support the poor, the sick and the marginalized, strive to restore dignity, relieve suffering, and empower communities that thrive through cooperation. Guided by faith, we are called to walk alongside those we serve—advocating for equality,



sustainability, human dignity, peace, and care for God's creation. Together, we are working toward a future that is sustainable, compassionate and just.
