Syria – Türkiye Earthquake Response

A 7.8-magnitude earthquake has caused devastation in southeast Türkiye and northern Syria. Multiple aftershocks and a second earthquake have only made the situation worse. Over 5,000 have been killed and many more are missing or injured. Widespread building collapses have been reported and the search for survivors continues.

Please pray for all of those affected.

The Syrian population was already deeply affected by the ongoing war and the economic collapse of the country and now, many people must deal with being displaced, losing their livelihood and surviving the harsh winter conditions.



Bhachini Resumes Her Business

In India, Bhachini Devi lost her husband due to tuberculosis. After his death, she moved in with her eldest son and his family.

Using the money she earned from running her small general store, Bhachini took care of her family. Unfortunately, her eldest son also contracted tuberculosis, so Bhachini supported his treatment when he was in the hospital. When her income wasn't sufficient she had to take out a loan.

Sadly, her son also died from tuberculosis. The stress of the situation left her unable to run her business.

Her story became known to staff at the Mohulpahari Christian Hospital, supported by PWS&D, and soon Bhachini was provided with assistance to restart her store. This outreach turned her life around.

Now, Bhachini beams with joy because her business is running well, her store has many more things to sell and she can continue to support her family.

This Lenten season, faithfully responds to Christ's call to provide livelihood support. Through PWS&D, we are helping people achieve their dreams and support their families.

MISSION MOMENT

In Pakistan, Gauri learned how to cut and sew at an early age. As an adult, this knowledge allowed Gauri to contribute to her family's income by working as a seamstress. After her husband was killed in an accident, Gauri's income was not enough to provide for her family on her own. Gauri was selected for a Presbyterian World Service & Development project that provides emergency food



assistance to families in need, as well as longer-term support through small business training and development. The food aid the family received made it possible for Gauri to save a portion of her monthly income that would have otherwise been spent on food. With the money she saved, Gauri was able to further her child's education and stock her tailoring shop with more materials.
