The 2022-23 Publicly Funded (Free) Flu Vaccine Program

Influenza circulation has been at a historical low since the onset of Covid-19. Various reasons are associated with: masking, isolation, distancing, increased hand-washing, more cleaning, etc.(PHAC Vol: 48-9, Sept. 2022

However, we are expecting a dramatic increase in this 2022-23 influenza season because all these nonpharmaceutical preventative measures have been or are being dropped. The flu vaccine is a safe. at: public es.

effective way to help people stay healthy, prevent illness and save lives. Flu shots are available a
health clinics across our province, at some physician and nurse practitioner offices and pharmaci
☐ Anyone six months and older can receive the flu vaccine.
☐ Children age six months to five years must be immunized at an SHA public flu clinic, a public
health office, or by a physician or nurse practitioner.
☐ Getting vaccinated is especially important for people at high-risk of influenza complications
(pregnant women, young children, elderly, persons with underlying health conditions, immune-
compromised) and their caregivers.
☐ This year, eligibility for the high-dose influenza vaccine (Fluzone®) has been expanded to all
residents 65 years of age and older.
☐ Also new this year, all Saskatchewan residents can book the entire family's flu and COVID-19

vaccinations online in one appointment. Family appointments can also be booked by telephone at 1-833-SASKVAX (1-833-727-5829). Families may also visit an SHA walk-in clinic to receive their vaccinations.

Know before you go

- ☐ Bring your Saskatchewan health card with you to receive your immunization.
- ☐ Be prepared to wait an additional 15 minutes after receiving your immunization.
- ☐ Consent forms (where required) are available at clinic locations.
- ☐ Covid Boosters are available at the same time but check first when making an appointment For more information phone, text or email Laura, Pastoral Care Nurse

MISSION MOMENT

Village Safe Motherhood Committees are a vital part of Presbyterian World Service & Development's maternal, newborn and child health programming in Malawi. The people who run the committees work tirelessly to ensure that pregnant women and their partners are informed about the community services



available to them before, during and after the birth of their child—and why these services are so important. Committee staff advise women to attend check-ups and deliver at a health-care facility, as well as encourage partner participation. They also educate parents about the importance of vaccination and proper nutrition. This is life-saving work for many pregnant women and infants in Malawi.

DAILY PRAYERS

Sunday, November 13 We give thanks and pray for caregivers in Malawi who work to ensure that children have a safe environment to live, play and learn, as well as access to vital health-care services.

Monday, November 14 We pray for the members and work of the Committee on Church Doctrine.

Tuesday, November 15 We pray for the people who gather and serve at Place of Hope Indigenous Presbyterian Church in Winnipeg, Manitoba, and we give thanks for their ministry.
